John reiterated the date for the AGM will be May 9th.

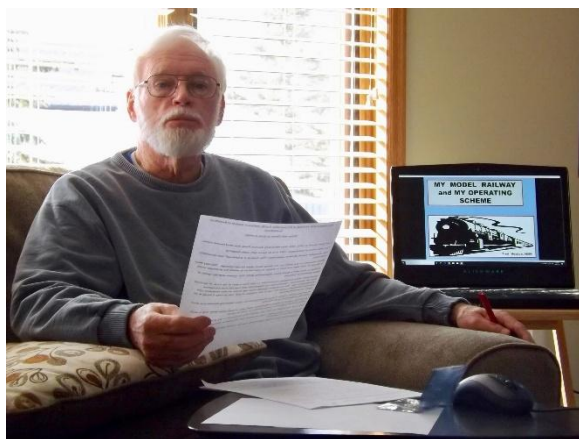
There was a motion to adjourn by Alan Graham. The meeting was adjourned at 8pm.

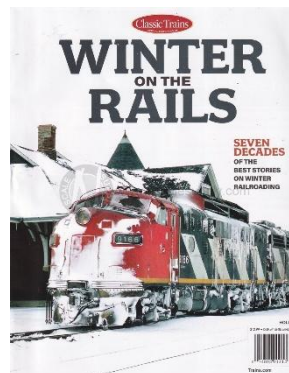

He is also be looking for volunteers to manage the door and WMRC table for Saturday and Sunday. We also need volunteers for take down on Sunday.

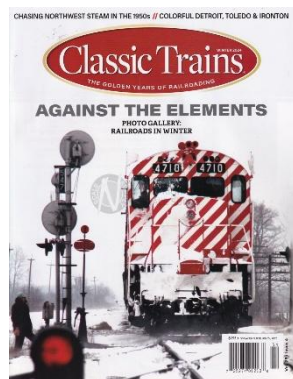

Model Railroad Photography Tips

If you attended the May 2025 WMRC Awards Dinner, you heard Cliff Davidson say something like this: *"I keep winning the model photo contest year after year because nobody else enters except me. I hope that in 2026 there is some competition."* I'm also reminded of a brief conversation with Bart Hasselfield wherein he wished that Members provided more photos of their models, not only at the monthly meetings but also at the Spring Open House.



Some Club members might think that taking a photo of their various models is too hard. As Cliff can tell you, that is far from the truth, and I hope that after reading this article that you, too, will enter some model photos at the Spring 2026 Open House.

The two key basics are sharpness and composition. Viewers expect quality images that are sharp, well composed, and free of distractions. Sharpness is a result of focusing, of course. Composition is another virtue. Most models are shot at a 45° angle so that the viewer can see the front and at least one side of the model. There are times when this is great; but there are others when a straight-on side shot can convey the sense of the model's details. You need to watch out for the camera casting a shadow.

Knowing the basics of how to use your camera is part of the equation. You can use one of those ultra-expensive cameras that some Members have, the quality of the newest generations of cellphone cameras can do an equally impressive job.



If you want to use a tripod – which Cliff will tell you he has never, ever used – most cellphones don't have the correct threaded hole for a tripod. But you can purchase a table-

top tripod model; this one from Amazon even comes with a remote control! **Aureday Phone Tripod, Flexible Tripod for iPhone and Android Cell Phone**

There's more to good images than just focus and composition, though. We live in an age where photo-editing software can fix some things, but it can't correct everything. The tips here cover simple, but particularly important, things you



can do before putting the camera on the tripod and snapping images.

Dust is something every layout owner struggles with. Before photographing your model, it's important to give it a thorough cleaning. A soft paintbrush and a can of compressed air make short work of dust that's accumulated on locomotives and rolling stock.

Check the details. When taking that photo, make sure the handrails and stanchions are in their sockets on locomotives. A popped railing or stanchion will show up as a distracting detail. Bent handrails, dislodged stanchions, and warped running boards draw attention to images for the wrong reasons.

If your photo has a building in it, remember that it shouldn't "float." Barrels next to a building and weeds along the foundation conceal gaps where a building meets the lot. Strategically placed figures and vehicles will conceal gaps; a few pallets would also be appropriate for an industrial setting.



Take lots of pictures! It costs nothing until you print them, so take plenty and then you can select the best pictures on your computer.

When composing a photo, study everything that's in the viewfinder.

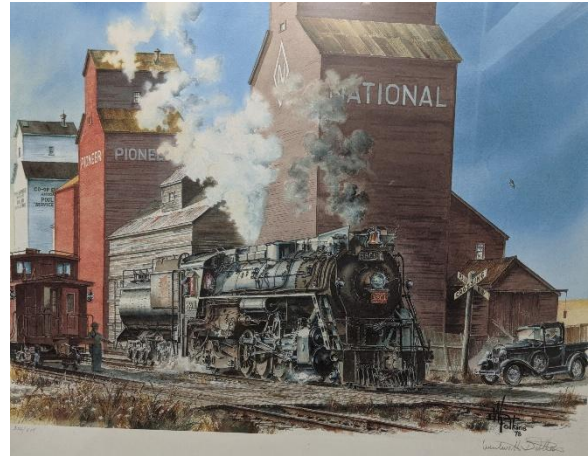
Study the images in the display on the back of the camera. Zoom in and scroll around the photos as necessary.

On-camera flash tends not to give the best results, so avoid it unless there is absolutely no alternative. Diffused natural daylight works best; where you can, keep the source of the light behind you, or close to behind you, but watch out for shadows!

The automatic white balance on your camera will cope with most situations, but if you are taking pictures under fluorescent or tungsten lighting then try using the appropriate white balance setting on your camera. Alternatively, try altering the colour balance in the picture on your computer with widely distributed photo enhancement software if you think it doesn't look quite right.
