WMRC General Meeting November 14th, 2025

The meeting was called to order at 7:30pm.
There were 28 members present including new member Graham Leathers.

President-John Bate

John asked for approval of the October 18th meeting minutes. Cliff Davidson made a motion to approve the minutes of the October 18th, 2025 general meeting and the motion was seconded by Ken Crockatt. The motion was approved.

John talked about several members' latest issue of the Lantern ending up in junk folders and mentioned that he had resent the Lantern today. John feels that the problem lies somewhere in the current issue of the Lantern and suggested that all members whitelist the club email address.

HYN MP15AC #1505 (Ex SOO #1550) by Rob Sarna

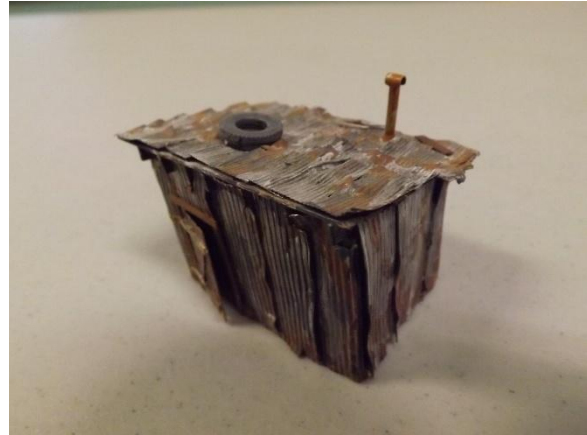
Prototype Locomotive was one of 64 units built for the Milwaukee Road. The model is an Athearn Genesis locomotive from one of the original runs. Electronics were updated to a current Athearn Genesis light board and LEDs, and 21-pin Tsunami2 decoder.

The factory SOO "Bandit" paint was weathered further and upgraded with fresh new patches underneath the cab windows using Microscale decals, for my freelance Huron & Yale Northern RR (HYN). The working ditch lights are scratch built and programmed to flash when the horn is activated.



Shanty by a Junk Yard by Marvin Fetch

A simple storage shack built from scratch with parts from the spare box can be built in one evening.



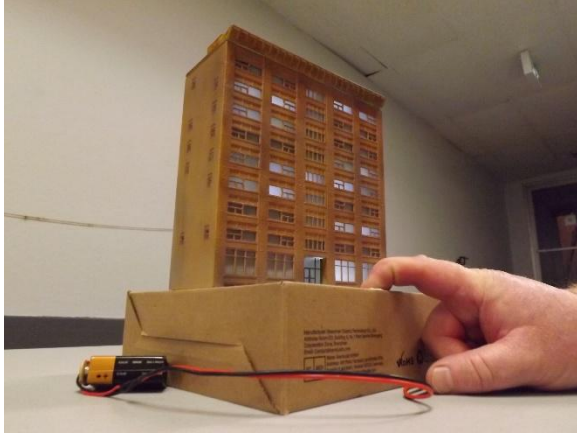
Yard Office by Bob Harrison

This HO Scale building is from the Walther's Cornerstone Yard Office Kit (#933-3517). It was built according to the kit instructions. It was painted and the weathered. The windows were frosted to defuse the interior lighting. An advertising signed added to the side of building.



138 Main St East by Darrell Brownlee

I wanted to see if I could replicate a downtown building just from looking at Google Maps. Building designed with Fusion360 CAD and printed using a Filament printer. Due to space constraints, the building is not as wide as the original and the roof is different. LEDs installed on each floor in different locations for a variety of lighting schemes. Painting was just air brushed with various tones and then dusted with chalk for aging, trying not to match the original building.



Digitrax DT400 Throttle Battery Cover by Darrell Brownlee

Designed and 3d printed a battery Cover and adapter that holds the cable out of the way. The adapter glues on to the back of the 400 series throttles and battery cover slips in like the factory cover. If anyone is interested in this cover, I could arrange to print a few at material cost.



Car #'s CN 873595 & CN 87300 by Dwayne Miller

I have two Deluxe Innovations model 10040 Gunderson Hi-Side 100 TON Wood Chip cars in Canadian National Railway in N-Scale. The bottom half of the car is foam and the top half I glued saw dust from my table saw to simulate a chip load. Each car is weighted to 0.1 of an oz to the MRA standards to the length of these N-Scale cars.



"N" Scale: 2 Stall Engine House by Richard Mikolayenko

The two stall engine house was a wood kit. The exterior was washed with yellow paint. Paper shingles were applied to the roof. A brown wash paint was applied to the doors. One window was left open to provide venting for the building.

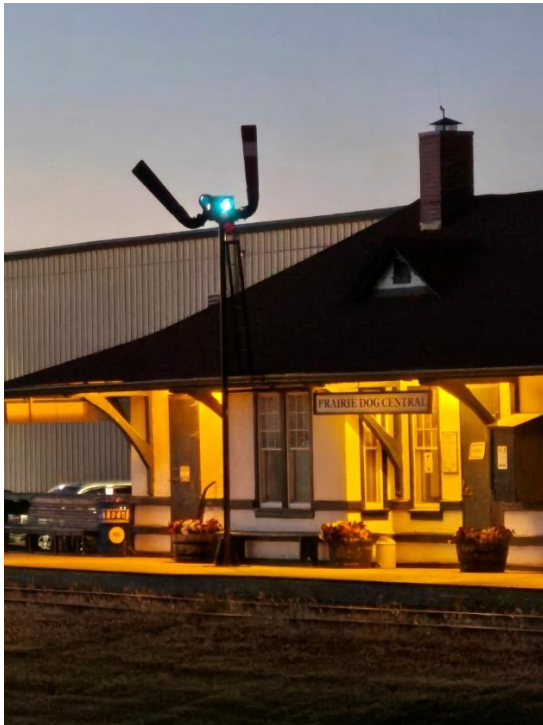


Monthly Photo Contest
